On the wildlife side I can report two sightings of a male lion by one of the Park scouts; hippo footprints directly in front of the Lodge, which is the first sighting in living memory; Giant Eagle Owl, Barred Owl, Martial Eagle, Brown Snake Eagle, Bushbucks, Bateleur Eagle, Large Spotted Genet and finally, Reedbuck. All but the lion I personally have seen.
